

ISU TRIAL AWARDS GERMANY 1998

Artemisia lactiflora 'Elfenbein':

This cultivar is a mutant of *Artemisia lactiflora*, which is marked with a good resistance opposite the mildew; the plants are 150-170 cm high, upright, stable and rich flowering; they have large inflorescences, the flowers are ivory-white; the flowering time is from the end of June to the end of September; later the plants have a good winter-aspect.

Habitats: GR2-3 / Fr2-3, so-hs; *)

Originator, Introducer and Announcer: Helmut Stade, 1990/1992/1993



Geranium (gracile x ibericum) 'Sirak'

This cultivar is the first Clon of the hybrid between *G. gracile* (habitat: woodland = G) and *G. ibericum* (habitat: montain-meadows = Fr2-3) and can be used in both habitats; the plants are 50 cm high, broad upright, the foliage is large, covers the ground good; in the autumn it changes in the yellow color; the flowers are sterile, 5 cm in diameter, bright purple, the veins are darker, the flowering time is from July to October.

Habitats: GR2/Fr2, hs-sch; *)

Ligularia x hessei 'Laternchen'

This cultivar is a seedling of *Ligularia x hessei*; the plants are 80 cm high, the foliage is dens, compact, the inflorescences are short, dens, just above the leaves; the flowers are golden-yellow to bright orange, they are very effective in June and July, also later in the seed-phase.

Habitats: GR2-3 / G2-3, Fr2-3, hs-so; *)

Nepeta x faassenii 'Walkers Low':

This cultivar may be selected as a seedling of *Nepeta x faassenii*. It is very vigorous, some broader than 'Six Hills Giant', have long, slender, lateral inclined inflorescences and violet flowers; it is flowering long time, from May to September.

Habitats: FS1 / Fr1, so

Originator and Introducer of this cultivar are not certain known; according to ascertainsments of Dr. Alan Leslie this cultivar was found by Mrs Jane Taylor in a garden at "Midlands" and offered in the catalogue 1988 of the nursery Four Seasons, Fornsett, St Mary, Norwich, Norfolk. Plants of this cultivar were sent by the gardener of Perennial Plants Ernst Pagels at Leer/Germany to the Berggarten at Hannover in 1993, where they were planted and observed by the colleagues. Finally this cultivar was announced in 1998 by Ingmar Guldner, Berggarten Hannover, to the International register.



Sedum telephium 'Matrona'

(*Sedum Telephium* Hybride 'Matrona')

This cultivar was selected as a seedling of *Sedum telephium* ssp. maximum 'Atropurpureum', supposed as a hybrid of this cultivar with *Sedum telephium*; 'Matrona' is 60 cm high, their stems are stable, dark brownish-green; their inflorescences ("heads") are large, bright pink, later dark brown; this cultivar is flowering from the middle of August to the end of September; it has a very good winter-aspect.

Habitats: Fr1b /FS1-2b, B1-2, so; *)
